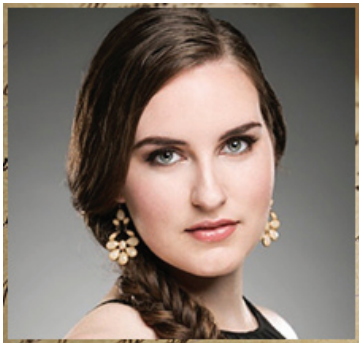

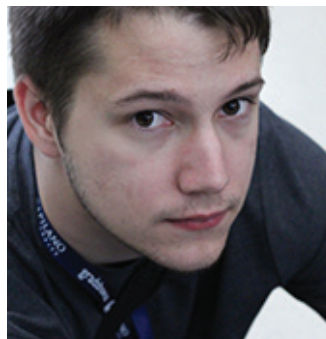

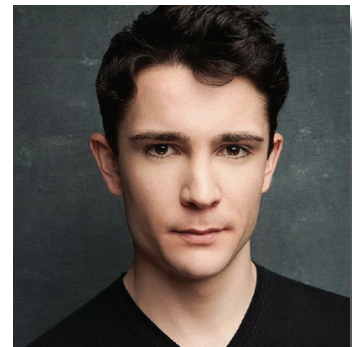

Being a member of a theatre audience is a shared experience. While the actors and crews of each production have their jobs to do, so do you as an audience member in order to ensure a positive experience for everyone.

- Remove your hat as you enter the theatre.
- Turn off all electronic devices.
- Refrain from eating or drinking ANYTHING during a performance.
- Refrain from speaking to your neighbours during a performance.
- Keep your feet off the seats in front of you.

- Remember that you are in a theatre and not a gymnasium, therefore enthusiastic applause is the way in which you show your appreciation to the performers for a job well done.
- If you need to leave the Theatre for any reason during a performance, please exit through the back doors and the ushers will allow you to return to your seat at an appropriate time.
- Flash photography is prohibited during a performance.
- Use of any recording devices or apparatus that interferes with other audience members during a performance is prohibited.
- Only actors and crew members of each production are permitted on the stage.
